Summer Hiatus

Camping Prep

As you all know, camping season is just around the corner. Rather than re-print the usual article that you can all go back and read from last year and the year before... Just get your camper prepped for camping.

On our camper, I have been doing some work. I turned on the fridge to make sure it was working. During hunting season it kept randomly kicking off. So far, four days later, it is still working.

The lights in the trailer came with bulbs that we had replaced with LED's. They were bright, but not a diffused light and burned a hole in your eye if you looked at them. They also had individual ones burn out. Rather than replace them with the same LED's, I bought a whole new fixture.

I bought some <u>Naoevo RV lights</u> off Amazon instead. They were \$71.99 for eight, are about 12x5.5" in size, have cold white, natural light, and warm white built in, are dimmable, and remember the settings once you have them set!

They arrived last week, and I went over Saturday and replaced all the lights in the main part of the trailer. Wow, what a difference! Lots of bright, diffused light! After dad saw these, he ordered another eight to replace the rest of them in the bathroom and the front bedroom.

The batteries in the trailer were not holding a charge last fall during hunting season. We took them out and dad took them to Twin to the store and they tested them. They were bad, so we got two free batteries that are now installed!



Oh, you remember a few months ago I wrote an article about the tools I bought? Well, I took those to the trailer and discovered something I overlooked – a set of drill bits – I'll have to buy some!

Another thing I did, and I don't know why I didn't do this earlier, was buy some <u>bull rings for the</u> <u>bed of my truck</u>. These will make it much easier to strap down gas cans and other things instead of using the tied downs in the bottom of the bed.

Last week Bill Mefford made a trip to Burley and we worked on Kris's machine. It was leaking oil from around the valve cover gasket so we ordered a new gasket, valve cover, bolts, and associated gaskets. It took a few hours to install and now the leak is fixed!

Anyway, get your trailers in camping shape since Jerry has a campout planned for a few short weeks away!

Rides are open to current MVATVR members and invited guests.

Trail Difficulty Guide

Evel 1 - Beginner: Gravel or dirt surfaces that are relatively flat and wide. Generally wide enough for an ATV to pass a full-sized vehicle. May be dusty but are relatively smooth with no rocks or roots protruding more than three inches above the surface. Ride distance will be short, speeds very slow.

Level 2 - Advanced Beginner: Mild ups and downs, some narrow, mild rock, mostly roads and jeep trails, minor off camber. Two-wheel drive ok.

Level 3 - Intermediate: Loose gravel, sandy, rocky or rutty surface. May have short sections that are narrow. Can have blind turns, switchbacks, steep or roller coaster grades, some off-camber side hills, minor drop-offs, ruts and frequent changes in riding surfaces. Occasional obstacles may strike the frame. Four-wheel drive may be needed depending on conditions. Pace of ride will be a little faster, distances and length of ride will be longer.

Level 4 - Advanced Intermediate: Rocky surfaces, sharp turns, switchbacks, steep grades, narrow passages, low overhangs, ledges and large rocks. Can be slippery and muddy when wet. May have tree stumps, limbs or other debris. Machines with low ground clearance may strike or high center on obstacles. Four-wheel drive highly recommended.

Level 5 - Expert: Very rocky, steep, off

camber, high water crossings, large ruts. Large obstacles in trails, narrow with big drop offs. Four-wheel drive required, may need winch.



Club Rules

he Magic Valley ATV Riders (MVATVR), Inc.

would appreciate you being considerate of others and observing the following rules/guidelines while participating in club activities. Obviously, any actions that are unlawful or unsafe are prohibited.



1. Pets should be kept on a leash of no longer than 6 feet during any rides, campouts or other MVATVR events. Please be a responsible pet owner and respect the rights of others.

2. Idaho State Law states that being under the influence and/or consuming alcohol or illegal drugs while operating an OHV is illegal and therefore will not be tolerated by MVATVR, Inc.

3. Generator use should be with consideration for others in camp and a recommended quiet time from 10:00 PM to 6:00 AM needs to be observed.

4. By operating your machine in a safe responsible manner, waiting at intersections and corners, you can insure that fellow riders will not be left behind and everyone will have an enjoyable ride.
